U.S. Sugar Program Puts Thousands of Michigan Jobs At Risk

While the U.S. sugar program benefits one, small, special interest group - U.S. sugar producers - it puts at unnecessary risk more than 600,000 American jobs, including up to approximately 18,100 in Michigan.

According to 2012 Census data, the top three sectors for sugar-using industry employment in Michigan are:

- Bread and bakery product manufacturing;
- Fruit and vegetable canning, pickling and drying; and
- Breakfast cereals.

The Department of Commerce has found that for every one sugar-growing job in the United States saved through high U.S. sugar prices, approximately three American manufacturing jobs are lost. Those are jobs Michigan cannot afford to lose.
