

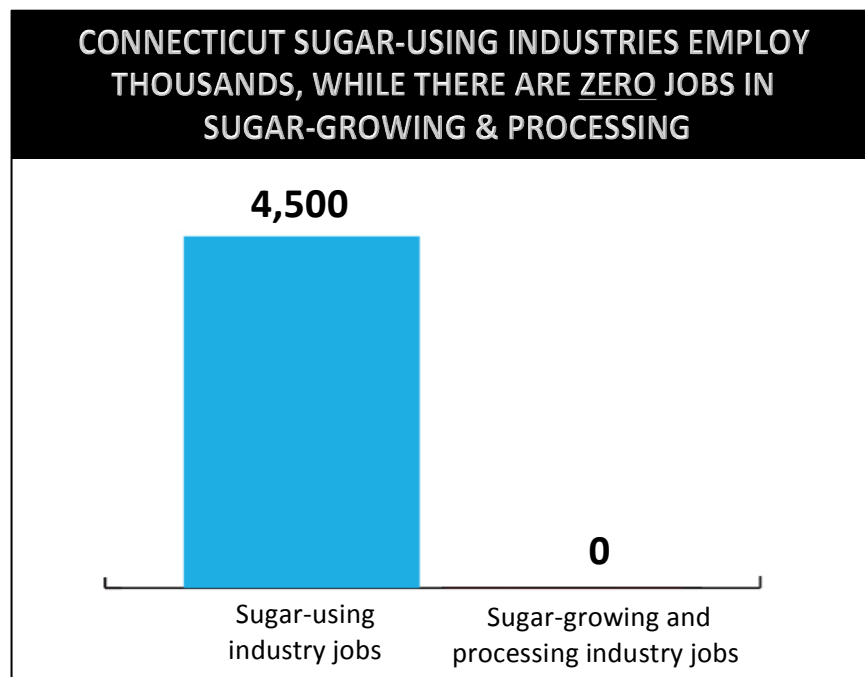

Sugar-Using Industries Employ Thousands of Connecticut Workers, Whose Jobs Are at Risk Because of Current Sugar Program

The current federal sugar program only benefits one small segment of the U.S. economy – sugar growers and processors, of which there are **zero in Connecticut**. Meanwhile, the program costs consumers an average of \$3 billion annually and puts at risk approximately 600,000 American jobs in sugar-using industries, including **up to approximately 4,500 in Connecticut**.



Congress can fix a program that hurts Connecticut consumers, taxpayers, food manufacturers and their workers.
