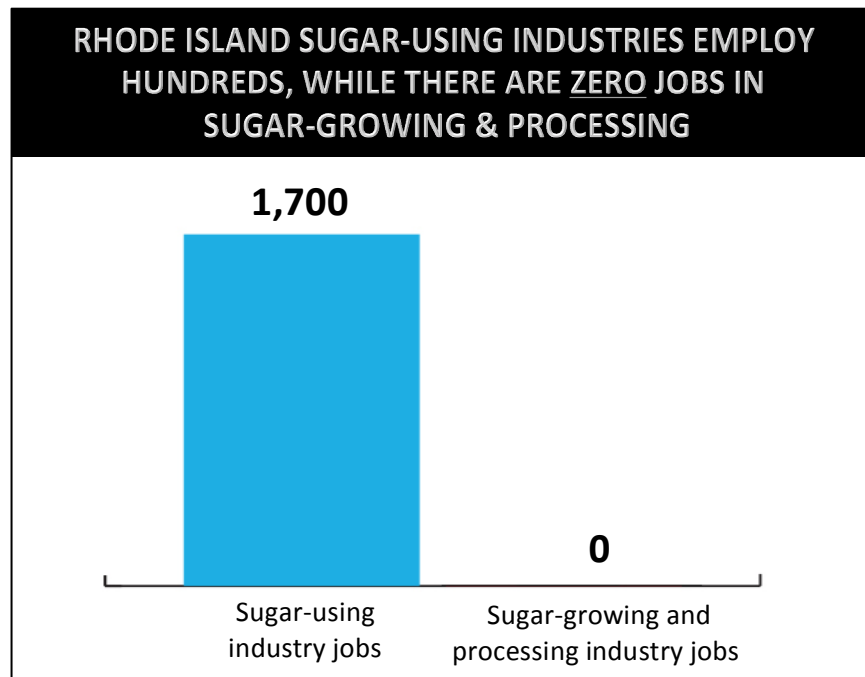

Sugar-Using Industries Employ Hundreds of Rhode Islanders, Whose Jobs Are at Risk Because of Current Sugar Program

The current federal sugar program only benefits one small segment of the U.S. economy – sugar growers and processors, of which there are **zero in Rhode Island**. Meanwhile, the program costs consumers an average of \$3 billion annually and puts at risk approximately 600,000 American jobs in sugar-using industries, including **up to approximately 1,700 in Rhode Island**.



Congress can fix a program that hurts Rhode Island consumers, taxpayers, food manufacturers and their workers.
